CHAPTER 1

Faithful Living as an Outsider

Daniel 1:1-2 ^{ESV}

In the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim king of Judah, Nebuchadnezzar king of **Babylon came to Jerusalem and besieged it.** ² And the Lord gave Jehoiakim king of Judah into his hand, with some of the vessels of the house of God. And he brought them to the land of Shinar, to the house of his god, and placed the vessels in the treasury of his god.

Why Exile?

Deuteronomy 28

Deuteronomy 28:15 ^{ESV}

But **if you will not obey** the voice of the LORD your God or be careful to do all his commandments and his statutes that I command you today, then **all these curses shall come upon you** and overtake you.

Deuteronomy 28:36 ^{ESV}

The LORD will bring you and your king whom you set over you **to a nation that neither you nor your fathers have known**. And there you shall serve other gods of wood and stone.

Deuteronomy 28:49 ^{ESV}

The LORD will bring a nation against you from far away, from the end of the earth, swooping down like the eagle, a nation whose language you do not understand.

Isaiah 39:6-7 ^{NIV}

The time will surely come when **everything in your palace**, and all that your predecessors have stored up until this day, **will be carried off to Babylon**. Nothing will be left, says the LORD. ⁷ And **some of your descendants**, your own flesh and blood who will be born to you, **will be taken away**, and they will become eunuchs in the palace of the king of Babylon.

Among these were **Daniel**, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah of the tribe of Judah. ⁷ And the chief of the eunuchs gave them names: Daniel he called Belteshazzar, Hananiah he called **Shadrach**, Mishael he called **Meshach**, and Azariah he called **Abednego**.

Daniel 1:8-10 ^{ESV}

But **Daniel resolved that he would not defile himself** with the king's food, or with the wine that he drank. Therefore he asked the chief of the eunuchs to allow him not to defile himself. ⁹ And **God gave Daniel favor** and compassion in the sight of the chief of the eunuchs, ¹⁰ and the chief of the eunuchs said to Daniel, “**I fear my lord the king**, who assigned your food and your drink; for why should he see that you were in worse condition than the youths who are of your own age? So you would endanger my head with the king.”

Daniel 1:11-13 ESV


Then Daniel said to the steward whom the chief of the eunuchs had assigned over Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah, ¹² “**Test your servants for ten days**; let us be given vegetables to eat and water to drink. ¹³ Then let our appearance and the appearance of the youths who eat the king's food be observed by you, and deal with your servants according to what you see.”

Daniel 1:14-16 ESV

So he listened to them in this matter, and tested them for ten days. ¹⁵ At the end of ten days it was seen that they were better in appearance and fatter in flesh than all the youths who ate the king's food. ¹⁶ So the steward took away their food and the wine they were to drink, and gave them vegetables.

Daniel 1:17-20 ^{ESV}

As for these four youths, **God gave** them learning and skill in all literature and wisdom, and **Daniel had understanding in all visions and dreams.** ¹⁸ At the end of the time, when the king had commanded that they should be brought in, the chief of the eunuchs brought them in before Nebuchadnezzar. ¹⁹ And the king spoke with them, and among all of them none was found like Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah. Therefore they stood before the king. ²⁰ **And in every matter of wisdom and understanding about which the king inquired of them, he found them ten times better than all the magicians and enchanters that were in all his kingdom.**
